What is an Academy?

A TJUHSD Academy is like a "school within a school" that is focused on the academy's theme. It allows students to get hands-on learning experiences through both school and community partnerships. Students select an academy based on an area of interest and are cohorted in their academic classes. The theme curriculum for each academy is reinforced through several courses throughout their high school experience, via interdisciplinary projects, and other events. Academy students find connection and relevance between school and their futures in both college and career.

What are reasons to join?

In addition to having classes tailored to be more engaging for students interested in the subject matter, the cohorted classes create a campus within a campus. The teachers in the Academy are all working with the same students making it possible to give extra support to the students. The most compelling reason to join an academy comes in the form of work-based learning experiences. Academy students are given skills-based training like mock interviews, job shadows and internships as well as lessons in basic professionalism. Plus, academies participate in industry field trips, college tours, guest speakers, volunteer opportunities and more!

Why would I choose just one area to study?

Although Academy classes are centered around a theme, students will get a complete well-rounded education and be better equipped to enter the workforce or college upon graduation. Some students may decide to continue to pursue the academy area of study after high school based on their experiences, while other students might choose to focus on other areas of study post-graduation. The student benefits from the opportunity to explore education through the art, engineering, medical, or protective services fields in high school while taking courses they need to graduate.

What does it take to get into an academy?

Admission to the Academies is not dependent on previous academic performance. Academies are designed to meet students where they are academically and help them achieve their full potential.

2. Submit your application online by December 17, 2021.

What if the academy I want to join is not my designated high school? Will I have to transfer?

Yes. All incoming students must transfer to the school that houses the academy of their choice. If this applies to you, be sure that you fill out the application online by the deadline of December 17, 2021. The academy application covers the transfer process. Academy of Engineering (AOE)

AOE suppléments cohorted core classes with an array of elective courses that provide students with a taste of a broad range of engineering topics and fields. The honors engineering classes, such as Intro to Engineering Design, Computer Integrated Manufacturing, Principles of Engineering, and Engineering Design and Development move students from drawing and designing to creating and building, all with a goal of being ready to go to college or enter a technical career after high school. Students come out of the program with CAD certification and have the opportunity to earn other certificates.

Arts, Media, & Entertainment (AME)

Students in the Arts, Media & Entertainment Academy prepare for college and career through projects and presentations in a four-year sequence. Students use visual art, performing art, and computer/film art to navigate their way through the AME Academy coursework. Classes include 3D Art, Drama, Digital/Film Art, and Advanced 3D Art. The AME Academy also completes one of the CTE Pathways for Art. Additionally, students are given educational experiences through trips to museums, plays, colleges, and community-based businesses. Mentors from our local community partnerships work with AME students to build career skills. Pre-Med Academy (PMA)

The Pre-Medical Academy is the place to be if you envision yourself in a career geared towards helping people. But, it's not just about doctors and nurses! The program of study includes a heavily science-based curriculum so that all members will be competitive on college applications and have exposure to a very well-rounded and rigorous education. You will learn about the multitude of career opportunities in the field of health including veterinary, lab science, biotechnology, and even medical offices. Two tracks are available, the Medical track for those wanting to become doctors and nurses, and the Allied Health Track which is for students wanting other careers in the medical field.
