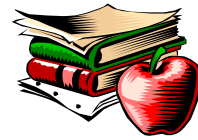

Pool Maintenance Technician

DEFINITION

Under the supervision of the Director of Facilities, the Pool Maintenance Technician works in the care of equipment and upkeep of the swimming pool facilities, and other related duties as required.

Distinguishing Characteristics

Duties in this class are distinguished from those performed in the Maintenance I Class in that they require more knowledge of the basic operations and methods involved and the ability to carry out the functions of this class without supervision. [The duties listed below are typical of Maintenance II and III Classes collectively, but no one position would normally include all of these duties]. The Duties in this class include general grounds duties as assigned.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES/ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Monitors, handles, and installs all chemicals for swimming pools. E
- Performs cleaning of swimming pools. E
- Performs minor repairs to swimming pools. E
- Responsible for ordering and maintaining inventory of chemicals, parts, and supplies as needed. E
- Works with skilled plumbers, painters, carpenters, electricians or other tradesmen and grounds employees where some knowledge of the basic operations and methods involved is necessary. E
- Repairs fences and gates. E
- Does semi-skilled plumbing and minor repair work on doors, windows, roofs, floors, and other building parts. E
- Assists with installation of electrical wiring and fixtures. E
- Performs semi-skilled painting work. E
- Assembles furniture and other structures. E
- Makes minor adjustments and keeps equipment in good repair. E
- Performs heavy manual labor, custodial, and grounds work as directed. E
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Education

Experience

One year experience in general swimming pool maintenance, including the handling of chemicals desired.

DOJ and FBI fingerprint clearance

Negative TB test within the last four years

National Swimming Pool Foundation Certification as a Certified/Spa Operator

KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES

Knowledge of

- Proper swimming pool cleaning methods and techniques and use of swimming pool chemicals.
- Basic operations, tools and terms used in building, grounds and custodial maintenance.
- Fundamentals of carpentry, painting, plumbing, and shop practices.

Ability to

1. Quickly learn the necessary procedures and methods used to maintain campus swimming pools in good working order.
2. Secure and keep current certifications as a Certified Pool/Spa Operator.
3. Maintain positive and cooperative working relationships with supervisor, students and other employees.
4. Use proper methods of maintenance or mechanical repair work, and acquire skill quickly in work requiring mechanical ability.
5. Drive vehicle safely and in accordance with traffic laws.
6. Perform heavy manual labor.
7. Lifting, carrying, pushing, and pulling object(s) weighing up to 75 pounds.
8. Understand and carry out written directions.
9. Ability to plan, organize and schedule work.
10. Perform varied tasks.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS AND WORKING CONDITIONS

Environment

- Indoor/outdoor environment subject to changing conditions and temperatures exceeding 90 degrees at times.
- Working on ladders at varying heights.

Physical Demands

- Maintain balance.
- Lifting, carrying, pushing, and pulling object(s) weighing up to 75 pounds.
- Standing for extended periods of time.
- Reaching overhead, horizontally and above the shoulders.
- Dexterity of hands and fingers to operate a variety of specialized tools and equipment.
- Clarity of vision at varying distances to operate equipment and to drive.
- Verbal, auditory, and written capabilities to effectively communicate in an articulate manner.
- Continuous hand-eye coordination and manipulation of large and small objects.

Hazards

- Working with chemicals, tools, and powered machinery.
