DEFINITION

- 7. Ability to assist a diverse range of students in learning choral music.
- 8. Ability to produce a high quality work product, i.e. play with expression, sensitivity, and accuracy; meet schedules and timelines.

- 9. Ability to display interpersonal skills using tact, patience and courtesy with students, administration, and staff.
- 10. Understand and carry out oral and written instructions.
- 11. Communicate effectively, both orally and in writing.
- 12. Ability to learn new or updated skills/equipment or computer systems and programs and apply to current work.
